1. The Position

As a member of the Mental Health team, this role will provide high quality, culturally appropriate and evidence-based counselling and mental health services to clients accessing our services. You will have National registration and/or membership with your professional body.

The role will also co-develop and deliver our mental health training and awareness program to other service providers and the communities throughout the West Pilbara.

The position is based at Karratha Central Healthcare and is part of a multi-disciplinary team, providing patient-centred care to people in the West Pilbara.

2. Qualifications

Tertiary qualifications in Psychology, Social Work, Mental Health Nursing, Psychotherapy or a relevant health discipline with postgraduate studies in mental health.

3. Supervisory Responsibilities

There are no direct supervisory responsibilities with this role, however you will work as part of a broader Mental Health team.

4. Hours of Work

This position will be employed up to 38 hours per week with flexible working hours available. Some out of hours work and travel will be required as part of this role.
